

Mort purchased a partially built Dianna kit at one of our auctions. The hull as purchased was completely planked, The gun deck installed and planked. The stern counter bulkheads were installed as well as the taffrail bland and the beams for the Quarterdeck and Forecastle (two photos above and right). As was done on his beautiful model of Victory, Mort plans to detail the Captains cabin, add checkerboard floor covering and other details on the fore deck.

To allow him to do that, he has removed the stern fascia, transom and their counter patterns. He then removed all of the upper deck beams. He replaced two bulkheads at the stern with framing and removed the taffrail. He also cut back the deck planking in the cabin area to be replaced with an inlaid wood checkboard pattern. Below are photos of the model as it is now. Good progress Mort.









Skipjack 1890-1920, Scale 1:48? Wye River Models Kit bashed

The model is not of a specific boat, but a representation of a typical design of a Chesapeake Bay Oyster boat in the late 19th, early 20th century. When Dennis built the Spritsalt Skif several years ago, he used the plans published by Schiffer Books, authored by Steve Rogers and Patricia Staby-Rogers. They worked well for him so he used the same source for the Skipjack.







Tom is close to completing RMS Titanic. He has installed all of the 30 ft boats as well as the Marconi Antenna that is strung between the masts and connected via a stress isolator to the radio room. Tom used 0.008" Inconel wire from Model Kasten. While there weren't enough boats tragically most of those were only half full. The two 25' open boats and the coal handling booms are next.
