






Battleship New Jersey



Syren Ship Model

Chuck Passaro

Chuck continues with his prototype model of Speedwell. The bulwarks have the lining and spireking planks installed. Chuck noted that Speedwell is a small ship but due to the large scale of this model, fittings do appear overscale although they aren't. This is especially apparent with the gratings understanding that many otherwise good models are spoiled by oversize spacing on the gratings. He will be starting the Forecastle planking. All of that planking will be laser cut and that brings up a bit of a quandary. If you don't have the tools, Chuck used to do all of this by hand. Now, he questions if we are forgetting how to do it by hand. He notes that wooden kits are approaching where many plastic kits are in that it is now becoming assembling pieces rather that building them. Bill noted that irrespective of that, Syren has opened up a complex model to more model builders. Chuck says that he sort of misses making things by hand. What do you think about this? Chuck is also making use of available figures that are 1:35 scale. For example, he included a bilge rat in the model. This model will be rigged and possibly have sails.
